2016 Highlights and Financial Statement

Through your partnership with Wings of the Eagle, you blessed and made a difference in the lives of many poor indigenous people in Mexico. In spite of many challenges that were faced during the year, your generous gifts made some wonderful things possible. Here are some highlights of 2016:

- Free hot nutritious meals were served to indigenous children who come from the nearby agricultural labor camps on the outskirts of Ensenada. Over 3,900 individual meals were served during the year.
- Food staples (1750 lbs beans, 1350 lbs rice, 1800 lbs flour, 750 lbs oatmeal, 1200 eggs, 400 lbs soy imitation
 meat products and 1800 lbs powdered milk) were given out on a regular weekly basis to 39 families, and
 another 33 families came for staples once or occasionally. Sugar and vegetable oil were given out at Christmas
 time as a special treat.
- Drinking water—34,000 gallons of clean drinking water was purchased and given away to the poor families from the labor camps. Children and their mothers walk to Pastor Frank & Detra's mission home to fill their empty containers and carry them home to their families. This is an especially critical need during the hot summer months.
- Medical care-- Free medical clinics were held for the poor, staffed by a Mexican physician. 104 patients were seen. Prenatal exams and well-baby checkups were provided, and various illnesses were treated, particularly respiratory infections among children. Medications, immunizations and vitamins were provided free of charge to the clinic patients. Assistance with further medical care (patient transported for lab work, ultrasound, or to hospital) was provided when needed. Detra personally attended 29 births, all of which were teen mothers; 12 were home births. Instruction was given about the Zika virus and Pastor Frank taught by example how to fill in mosquito breeding grounds in 7 labor camps.
- Advocacy before various government institutions (particularly Sector de Salud, hospital, and applying for birth
 certificates or Fed. ID) was provided by Pastor Frank. This is very time consuming, but very important to the
 indigenous people, many of whom do not speak Spanish and are mostly illiterate. Children cannot attend school
 without a birth certificate, but without someone who speaks Spanish and understands how the system works,
 they would not be able to get what they need at these government agencies.
- Education—Indigenous children were enrolled in school and assistance with homework was given. Those who
 receive after school help are more successful in school. The Homework Helps program is making use of used
 computers for the kids.
- Blankets-- a large local resort donated 215 good used comforter type blankets and 120 were given to poor indigenous families, 92 to men and women prisoners who Pastor Frank and Detra visit.
- Christmas celebration—Generous donors provided for a lovely Christmas party for the indigenous children with food, piñatas, and gifts which were purchased and sent to Mexico by volunteers. The children were blessed!

These activities are a wonderful blessing and bridge-builder to Pastor Frank & Detra's indigenous neighbors. They have many opportunities for ministry, Bible teaching, and showing the love of God. Their ministry resulted in 59 people who became believers in Christ, 22 of whom were baptized in water.
