Thanks to our generous partners, we received \$5035 in funds designated towards these needs!

The electricity is now connected, and the playground construction has been started. We are excited about these developments, and we are very grateful for your support. An extra ministry vehicle is still needed.

Detra was so thrilled after getting the electricity connected, she said, "I must say it feels so bizarre to just flip a switch, and voila, light!we have been on generator power for some 11-12 years. I feel like I am on an episode of Star Trek!"

Busy days

Summer activities are in full swing at the ministry center and mission home. In addition to the regular feedings and twice monthly medical clinics, they are having "summer school" for the indigenous children from the camps.

Here are some of the things that the children are learning: Bible verses (weekly memorization and how to apply it in life), basic manners, health and hygiene topics such as how, when, and why we wash our hands, basic oral hygiene, and how to write their full names, address, birthdate and place. They also learned how to pray, in their native Mixteco Alto and in Spanish. They have arts and crafts and drama (skits) to reinforce the lessons.

One of the most important things they learned about was loving their neighbor, and putting that love into action. The children attend about five hours a day, which includes the meal time.

took a shipment of donated medical supplies from Hands of Hope Northwest for the clinic, and she volunteered to help triage patients at the clinic in July, which was a huge blessing.

Patients at the clinic include children and adults who suffer from a variety of illnesses and would not have the ability to receive medical care if they did not come to our free clinic. Pregnant women from the camps also come for prenatal care.
